Prof. Adive Boniface Udedibie, a professor of Animal Nutrition in the School of Agriculture and Agricultural Technology won the second prize individual award in Agriculture for his productive research work on cassava, to earn FUTO its overall second position at the fair.

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

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GLOBAL HAND WASHING DAY MARKED IN FUTO; Clean Hands Save Lives- Prof. Onwuliri

rof. C.O.E. Onwuliri, Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Owerri has stated that hand hygiene is critical to good health and constitutes the single most effective practice for preventing the outbreak and spread of communicable disease in every society and every setting. He made this declaration as chief host at the 2010 Global Hand Washing Day organised in FUTO by the Centre for Women and Child Research and Development in collaboration with the World Health Organisation on October 19, 2010.

According to Prof. Onwuliri, "a staggering four billion cases of diarrhoea occur annually, resulting in an estimated 2.1 million deaths. with majority of casualties being children under the age of five". He stated that diarrhoea also accounts for 4.3% of the total global disease burden and an estimated 88% of this burden is attributed to poor hand washing culture without soap, inadequate sanitation and hygiene. These risk factors, he stated, are second. after malnutrition, in contributing to the global burden of disease.

Speaking also, the Chairman of the occasion and former Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Evan Enwerem University, Owerri, Prof. B. E.B. Nwoke lamented that hand washing was not in the consciousness of Nigerians and advised that people should inculcate the habit of regular and repeated hand washing.

In her lecture entitled "The Disease Burden, the MDGs and the Global Handwashing Event" the Director, Centre for Women and Child Research and Development, Prof. (Mrs.) Viola Onwuliri recalled that the United Nations general assembly in 2008 set out October 15 of every year to create awareness on the importance of hand washing as part of environmental hygiene for healthy living. She noted that people contact dirt through toilets, touching of parts of the body and other materials in the environment.

Demonstrating the proper way of washing the hands, Dr. (Mrs.) Agatha Ndugbu, Senior Special Assistant to the Governor of Imo State stressed the need to wash hands thorougly with soap to remove disease-causing pathogens which contaminate our food. Similarly, Mr. Kanayo O. Kanayo, a Nollywood Star who graced the occasion and participated in the hand washing exercise urged the audience to be vanguards of proper hand washing in order to save lives.

Highlights of the day included the de-worming of everyone present, quiz competition featuring eight secondary schools and moderated by the Co-Chairman of the occasion and SUG President, Comrade Obinna Anyanwu. Government Secondary School, Owerri took the first position in the quiz while FUTO International School and Ikenegbu Girls Secondary School, Owerri took the second and third position respectively.

The event also featured presentation of awards by the organisers, the Centre for Women and Child Research and Development.

Dr. Aloysius Aguwa, Commissioner for Petroleum and Environment, Imo State was the special guest at the occasion. Other dignitaries at the event included the Principal Officers, Directors, Deans and Directors of the university, the Director, National Orientation Agency, other top government functionaries and media executives. - Tessy Iwuji



Council Approves The Construction of Vice-Chancellor's Lodge. **Principal Officers Quarters and 3 Student Hostels**

ouncil has approved the N143,157,057.15. The residential proposal submitted by Dunel Worldwide Limited Berlin, Abuja to construct a Vice-Chancellor's lodge, five residential buildings for principal officers and three student hostels on a buildoperate- and-transfer (BOT) basis.

The Vice-Chancellor's lodge will incorporate the main building, a guest house, domestic staff quarters, generator house, gate/security house, driver's lodge and a car park at the cost of

buildings for five other Principal Officers of the university will include the main buildings, domestic staff quarters, generator house, gate/security house and a car park at a total value of N345,675,336.25. The construction of three students' hostels was also part of the BOT arrangement at an estimated contract s u m o f N3.869.066.416.71. All the projects ware expected to be solely

funded by the developer and would be amortised over a period of ten years except the three students' hostels which be amortised in twenty one years.

Meanwhile the Vice-Chancellor, Prof. C. O. E. Onwuliri and the Developer/Managing Director of Dunel World Wide Limited, Berlin Abuja, Arc. Nwanne Emeh have executed the main contract agreement on terms specified in the Memorandum of Understanding.

23rd Convocation of FUTO Fixed for March 5, 2011 - Onno Ruhl, World Bank Country Director, Nigeria to deliver Convocation Lecture

he 23rd Convocation of the university and the last in the life of the Prof. C. O. E. Onwuliri administration has been scheduled for Saturday, March 5, 2011.

The conferment of first degrees, diplomas and higher degrees will be preceded by a convocation lecture entitled "Nigeria's Youth: Turning Challenge into Opportunity" by Onno Ruhl, World Bank Country Director, Nigeria. For the first time in the last four years, the university intends to combine the forthcoming convocation with an endowment fund launch.

FUTO WINS 2ND PRIZE IN AGRICULTURE AT THE 4TH EDITION OF NURESDEF

he Federal University of Technology, Owerri has won the second prize in the fourth edition of the Nigerian Universities Research and Development Fair (NURESDEF) organised by the National Universities Commission at the University of Nigeria, Nsukka from November 23-26, 2010. The fair provided a golden opportunity for the academia to showcase their research breakthroughs, fabrications and inventions to the outside world.

Prof. A. B. I. Udedibie, professor of Animal Nutrition won the second prize in the individual award category in Research and Development in Agriculture, which earned FUTO its second position. Prof. Udedibie's award was for his successful research - the transformation of cassava tubers into a cyanidefree, non-dusty and long lasting cassava tuber meal for animal feed.

The Department of Information Management Technology. headed by Dr. Amaobi Uwaleke, presented 14 research projects. Although, the projects did not attract awards to the group, yet, they made good impact on the university's overall performance at the fair.

In his presentation to Senate, Prof. Udedibie reported that feeding trials with the cyanidefree cassava tuber meal have shown that it can completely

replace maize as a source of dietary energy in fish and livestock production provided the feed is adequately supplemented with high protein feeds in view of the disparity in crude protein content between it and maize. According to him, the product appears to have the potential of being the best form in which cassava could be exported or imported as fish and livestock dietary source of energy.

Acknowledging the good efforts of FUTO contigent to NURESDEF, the Vice-Chancellor congratulated and commended Prof. Udedibie for the award which he described as an honour to the university. He directed the awardee to liaise with the Director of IPTTO to work out best modalities to patent the research work.

14 FUTO Students Win Innovators of Tomorrow (IOT) Research Grant

The National STEP-B Office, Abuja has announced the 2008/2009 awardees of its innovators of tomorrow research grant valued at 105,000 US Dollars to 14 FUTO students. Prof. Chidi Akujor, Project Manager, FUTO STEP-B made this report to the Vice-Chancellor vide a memo dated December 13,2010.

The awardees were in three categories - 11 Ph.Ds 2 M.Sc and 1 B. Tech. The PhD awards from the Department of Agric Extension went to Felix Ugwoke: Evaluation of the Implementation of the Unified Agricultural Extension Policy in South East - Nigeria and E.N. Okereke -Ejiogu: Approach of Local Economic Empowerment and Environmental Management Project (LEEMP) in Imo State, Nigeria,

From the Department of Crop Science and Technology, three got the research grants viz: C.P. Anyanwu: Quality and Genetic Analysis of Nine Rice (Oryza Sativa L.) Genotypes using Diallel Methods, C.T. Tom: Evaluation of Plantain/Pigeon Pea Intercropping System in South Eastern Nigeria and M.O. Ofor: Effect of Postharvest Handling on Shelf-Life and storage Quality of Tomato (Lypersicon Esculentum) in South-Eastern Nigeria. Ph.D Awardees from the Department of Maritime Management and Technology were Chinonye C. Ugboma: Performance and Efficiency Measurements in Nigerian Seaports and Chibueze Ibeawuchi: Economic Impact Assessment of River Ports in Nigeria: A Scenario Analysis.

J.O. Igbokwe: Production Characterisation and Performance Evaluation of Biodiesel; S.I. Onwukwe: Optimising Production in Oil-Rim Reservoir with Horizontal Well; C.A. Madu: Generalised Gradient Approximation in the Energy Band Structure of Semiconductors; and Sylvia I. 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MIGERIAN EDUCATION AND RESEARCH NETWORK, A MUST FOR NIGERIA! -Prof. Onwuliri Joins Study Visit to China

he Federal Government of Nigeria has been challenged to take urgent and sustained steps to establish the Nigerian Education and Research Network (NERNET) to serve as the backbone of a renewed commitment to exploiting modern technologies, especially ICT for national development. "Government must be made to see this as sine-gua-non to realising the goals of Vision 20-2020 and overall national technological transformation. The time for this is NOW!" This declaration was made by participants from the Nigerian university system, the National Film Institute and the National Research Institute for Chemical Technology on a study visit to China between November 19 and December 4, 2010. They noted that well developed higher educational institutions held the key to the much desired transformation of the Nigerian economy.

Prof. C. O. E. Onwuliri, Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Owerri, who was part of the 29-man team in China for the study visit funded by the Science and Technology Education at Post Basic Level (STEP-B) noted that the visit which had exposed Nigerian academics and policy makers to current trends and best practices in higher education, with emphasis on possibilities of partnership and cooperation with international institutions. professional associations and the organised private sector will impact positively on Nigeria.

The highlight of the study was the visit to CERNET (China Education and Research Network) headquarters. They noted that CERNET is a Chinese government funded project handled by the Chinese Ministry of Education and charged with the responsibility to manage all education portals, connectivity, domain registration, and all other e-education issues for all the educational institutions in China. According to Prof. Onwuliri, CERNET started in 1988 as a network project conceived by five of China's major universities and has 10 regional centres. 38 provincial nodes, with distributed bandwith capability of 15G interconnecting 2000 institutions (universities, educational organisations, and research institutes).

As an important national education and research infrastructure, CERNET supports many key national network applications including online recruitment for universities, admissions,

distance learning, digital library, GRID for education and research and makes outstanding contribution to education in China. "The key transformational development of China in the last few years had their roots in the catalytic effect of the establishment of CERNET" he reported.

The team was taken through the uneprint of the China next Generation Internet (CNGI), which is co-ordinated by CERNET. CNGI is aimed at constucting China's next generation internet backbones, developing key network technology and major applications for the next generation internet, promoting industrialisation and application deployment, and participating in related international co-operation and playing important roles in standards setting.

The team visited the headquarters of Huawei Technologies, one of the Chinese companies operating in Nigeria. Locations visited included the production exhibition hall: data centre; automatic logistics centre; Huawei Univeristy and video conferencing and telepresence exhibition centre.

The two teams also met with officials of Tsinghua University, which is one of the top 100 universities in the world and ranks number 1 in China. Established in 1911, it has a student population of about 32,000 with over 7.000 at PhD level and nearly 10,000 at Master level. Most activities are online driven based on the CERNET backbone, with over 1,200 professors, 1,100 Associates, and 1.100 postdoctoral staff. nearly 4 million library collections and 70TB of resource data as well as over 200 research institutes.

Prof. Onwuliri further noted that on December 2, 2010, the team visited the headquarters of Lenovo, a major manufaturer of laptops, desktops and e-education resources. The company was established in 1984 with a grant of only 25,000 US Dollars by the Chinese Government and currently has an average annual turnover of about 25 billion US Dollars. The team also visited the Beijing University of Post and Telecommunications (BUPT). BUPT has developed into an important research and development centre in the field of information technology and telecommunications in China. It has achieved a lot in the fields of communication network, information processing, network management, information security, optical fibre communications, wireless communications, computer application, binary optics, artifical intelligence and robot, he reported.

It may be recalled that Prof Onwuliri led the second batch of participants to China. Other team members were Prof. D. V. Uza, Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Agriculture, Makurdi; Prof. Adebisi M. Balogun, Vice-Chancellor, Federal University of Technology, Abeokuta; Prof. Olugboyega Comelius Ademosun, Project Manager (STEP-B), Federal University of Technology, Akure; Prof. Valentine Avobore Aletor: Project Proponent (STEP-B), Federal University of Technology, Akure; Prof. N. M. OMEIRE BREAKS THE JINX; **DELIVERS 20TH PUBLIC LECTURE**

istory was made on December 15, 2010 when Mr. Charles Obioma Omeire, Registrar of the Federal University of Technology, Owerri mounted the rostrum as the first non-teaching staff to deliver a public lecture at the university. In his lecture: "Town and Gown Dialectics: a Healthy Partnership or Marriage of Convenience", the 20th in the public lecture series, Mr. Omeire posited that quality of local leadership, disposition of university authorities to host communities, land issues, conduct and behaviour of staff and students residing in the host communities constitute contemporary challenges in town and gown relationship in Nigeria.

Mr. Obioma Omeire, an alumnus of the esteemed National Institute of Policy and Strategic Studies, Kuru and a Fellow of the Nigerian Institute of Management pointed out that town and gown marriage was most likely to be enhanced under a united, enlightened and selfless leadership than under a fractionalised uneducated. despotic and dubious leadership.

In his words, "the challenge before administrators and proprietors of tertiary institutions is to structure university processes and decision making to maximise the chance of creating win-win results among universities and their host communities.

He proposed the constitution of a standing university / community relations committee, the institution of scholarship programmes for indigent indigenes at all levels of education, execution of well sustained livelihood projects in host communities, and above all the promotion of multiple communication strategies. The university chief administrator suggested the appointment of a qualified person from the host community as member of the university governing council and the payment of adequate compensation to land owners, the

priority consideration of indigenes recruitment follow suit. in admissions and processes as means of peaceful coexistence of town and gown.

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VICE-CHANCELLOR ONWULIRI DELIVERS THE UNAA GOLDEN JUBILEE LECTURE AT OWERRI - Honoured With UNAA Distinguished Leadership Award

he University of Nigeria Alumni Association, Owerri branch has honoured Prof. C. O. E. Onwuliri, Vice-Chancellor of the Federal University of Technology, Owerri with the Distinguished Leadership Award at the Imo Concorde Hotel, Owerri. The colourful ceremony which was put together as part of events marking the golden jubilee celebration of the University of Nigeria, Nsukka featured among other things a public lecture entitled "The University of Nigeria, Nsukka and National Development" delivered by Prof. Onwuliri.

Prof. Onwuliri, a professor of parasitology and distinguished fellow of the Nigerian Academy pointed out that Science investment in education makes for national development. He recalled that the University of Nigeria came into existence on October 7, 1960 as the first indigenous and autonomous university. He noted that the university played a pioneering role in the development of higher education in Nigeria particularly in the area of curriculum development. "The course credit system (that is practised by every tertiary institution in Nigeria today) was the brainchild of the university" he declared .

According to the lecturer, it was the University of Nigeria that introduced the concept of General Studies into the Nigerian university system. He described the University of Nigeria, Nsukka as a builder and accumulator of human capital and stated that "no aspect of the university education in Nigeria could be exempted from the influence and impact of the University of Nigeria as it pioneered


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FUTO HOSTS "NASEF 2010"

He noted that out of the 35 generation licenses so far issued, 31 were for thermal power projects while coal, hydro, solar and wind had one generation licence each.

SUDDEN DEATH SYNDROME -Hypertension

The disease of interest deserving great attention is high blood pressure. This disease which is described as "the silent killer" is symptomless for many years, until a vital organ such as the heart, kidney, eye or the brain is damaged. A survey in USA shows that 38% of the adult black population and 29% of the adult white population are suffering from high blood pressure. Out of these, only two-thirds seek medical attention.

In FUTO, the monthly statistics of the health centre shows that only 2% of the staff are treated for high blood pressure. High blood pressure is diagnosed when there is a sustained systolic blood pressure of 140mmHg and above and a diastolic pressure of 90mmHg and above (BP > 140mmHg).

≥ <u>140</u>mmH 90

Untreated hypertension can lead to malignant hypertension which rapidly leads to stroke, heart failure and death.

High blood pressure is said to be essential hypertension when no known cause could be found. It is inherited and results from many conditions such as heart disease, arterial disease and others. In some patients, the cause is kidney disease, adrenal disease such as pheochromocytoma, hormonal disorder, the use of oral contraceptives, corticosteroids or drugs such as cocaine, licorice and alcohol. Sedentary lifestyle, obesity, and excessive amount of table salt in food have been found to cause high blood pressure. Disease conditions such as coactation of oarta, pregnancy and acute lead poisoning are known causes of high blood pressure.

Precaution should be taken by every adult to avoid falling victim to this silent killer which cuts across all social status. sexes and races. Every adult should develop the habit of checking his or her blood pressure at least once a month. When one experiences symptoms such as headache, dizziness, blurring of vision. excessive weakness, palpitation, tremor, irregular heart beat, anxiety or chest pain, it is necessary to consult a medical doctor and get blood pressure and heart check, carry out the prescribed medical laboratory investigations and obtain treatment.

Prof. G. E. Nworuh, Chairman, Committee of Deans welcomed all to the occasion and congratulated the FUTO HIV/AIDS Committee led by Prof. (Mrs.) Viola Onwuliri for taking up the challenge to educate the university community on the HIV/AIDS epidemic. He noted that since sexual intercourse is the predominant means of transmission of the virus globally, it had become imperative that concerted efforts must be made at all times to check the spread of the virus through access to information and education.

The lead paper was delivered by Rev Sr. (Dr.) Evangeline Oparaocha, Associate Dean, School of Health Technology. She stated that the rate of infection in Nigeria, with 6.5 million of her citizens living with the disease, has been described as one of the most rapidly increasing rates of HIV/AIDS cases in West Africa and accounted for nearly 10% of HIV/AIDS burden in the world. According to her, one million Nigerian children have already been orphaned by HIV/AIDS. She asserted that total abstinence was the best way to avoid HIV/AIDS. However, for those already living with the disease, she called on the Nigerian government to allocate sufficient funds for treatment especially in increasing access and subsidising anti-retroviral medication. She stressed that people living with AIDS can, with 100% adherence to their drugs live a healthy and active life.

The Co-ordinator of FUTO HIV/AIDS Committee, Prof. (Mrs.) Viola Onwuliri advised FISO students to say no to sexual temptations so as to safeguard their future. Stickers with the inscription "Say no to sex" were given to everyone and candles were lit as a symbol of access to human rights.

Other resource persons who presented papers at the occasion were Rev. Fr. Dr. Lawrence Iwuamadi, Chaplain of St. Thomas Aquinas Catholic Chaplaincy, FUTO; Venerable Kelechi Okere, Chaplain, Anglican Chapel of Light, FUTO and Mr. Martins U. Dike, a member of FUTO HIV/AIDS Committee.




