Abstract

The study evaluated the minimum initial capital requirement, growth in capital investment and employment generation of SMEs in the Niger Delta region of Nigeria. This is based on the premise that if the afore mentioned are known, potential investors would know the enterprise type/ activity to invest in. A sample of 400 SMEs across four states of the region were selected; data were analysed using descriptive statistics. The results of the analysis showed that initial capital investment varied considerably among the enterprises within and across the states; so were the growth in capital invested and employment generating capacities. Using the average number of persons currently employed per enterprise type as a proxy for employment generating capacity, ten enterprise types were identified for each state. It was therefore recommended that a combination of the indices evaluated can be used in funding SMEs in the region/ expanding existing ones for youth empowerment.
